Mei Qing is a professor of architectural history and architectural conservation in the department of architecture at Tongji University of China, an Expert Committee member of ICOMOS ISC SBH, and a consultant expert in world heritage institute of training and research for the Asia and the Pacific Region (Shanghai) under the auspices of UNESCO. Mei received her Ph.D. from the Chinese University of Hong Kong. Her academic interests focus on overseas Chinese architecture—particular Chinese building types: garden, temple, and huiguan. These types were transmitted from China to Southeast Asian countries along the maritime Silk Road. She has received Excellent Teaching Awards, Overseas Chinese Research Awards, China Post Doctor Award, Pujiang Talents Award, George R. Collins Award from SAH, and

J. Paul Getty Trust's GRI Connecting Art History Award 2013-2014. In recent years, Mei has taught architectural history and heritage, conservation and design studio. She has established close connections with ARC, ICOMOS, WHC UNESCO as well as universities, research organizations and institutes.
