

ALAN K. L. CHAN (Chair to introduce the Keynote Speaker)
Nanyang Technological University, Singapore



Alan K. L. Chan is Toh Puan Mahani Idris Daim Professor of Humanities and Dean of the College of Humanities, Arts, and Social Sciences, Nanyang Technological University (NTU), Singapore. Prior to his appointment to NTU, he was Professor of Philosophy at the National University of Singapore (NUS). During his tenure at NUS, he served in a variety of senior management posts, including Associate Provost for Undergraduate Education from 2007-2009. He was Visiting Professor at University of Toronto, Kyoto University, Chinese University of Hong Kong, and University of Washington, the last on a Fulbright Scholarship.

Prof Chan obtained his Ph.D. from the University of Toronto. His research focuses on Chinese philosophy and religion, and hermeneutics. He has published widely in early Chinese thought, especially Taoist philosophy. As Dean of the College of Humanities, Arts, and Social Sciences at NTU, he oversees the College's four constituent Schools—namely, School of Humanities and Social Sciences, Wee Kim Wee School of Communication and Information, and School of Art, Design and Media and the Nanyang Centre for Public Administration. A champion of liberal arts education, internationalization of higher learning, and interdisciplinary research, Prof Chan is also centrally involved in the University's strategic development in China.
